**Summary of Legislation:** This bill requires a party to a protective order proceeding to inform the court of any military protective orders issued by a military commander in effect between the parties. It allows a party to file a military protective order as evidence in a protective order proceeding and provides that the court may issue an ex parte protective order based upon this evidence.

**Explanation of Local Expenditures:** *Enforcement of Protective Orders:* This bill is likely to increase the number of protection orders issued by Indiana courts and, therefore, the amount of calls for service to local law enforcement agencies related to enforcement of those orders. Any increase in workload is within the routine functions of each agency and should be able to be met within existing resources.

*Courts:* The provisions of this bill may either increase or decrease the workload for courts associated with a given case depending on the facts of the case. The net impact on courts is indeterminate.
