

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

SB 221 # 2

DIGEST

Pharmacy organizational policy. Requires a pharmacy to have an organizational policy permitting a pharmacist to limit the provision of ancillary services and access points.

- 1 Page 3, between lines 14 and 15, begin a new paragraph and insert:
2 "SECTION 2. IC 25-26-13.2 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
3 AS A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
4 JULY 1, 2026]:
5 **Chapter 13.2. Ancillary Services of a Pharmacist**
6 **Sec. 1. This chapter does not apply to a pharmacy that is not**
7 **open to the public.**
8 **Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, "ancillary services" means**
9 **services performed by pharmacy personnel that are not directly**
10 **involved in the dispensation of a prescription drug. The term**
11 **includes the following:**
12 (1) Immunizations.
13 (2) Drug administration.
14 (3) Medication therapy management.
15 (4) Disease state management.
16 (5) Refill reminders.
17 **Sec. 3. (a) A pharmacy shall develop and implement an**
18 **organizational policy that permits a pharmacist to do all of the**
19 **following:**
20 (1) Limit the provision of ancillary services if, in the
21 pharmacist's professional judgment, the provision of ancillary
22 services cannot be safely provided or may negatively impact
23 patient access to medications.
24 (2) Limit pharmacy access points if, in the pharmacist's
25 professional judgment, limiting the access points will
26 minimize fatigue, distraction, or other conditions that
27 interfere with a pharmacist's ability to practice with

1 reasonable safety and competence.

2 (b) The organizational policy required under subsection (a)
3 must include an offer by pharmacy staff to make an appointment
4 for a patient or refer a patient to another location that is offering
5 ancillary services.

6 (c) If a pharmacy has not implemented an organizational policy
7 as required under this section, the pharmacy may not override the
8 control of the pharmacist on duty to limit the provision of ancillary
9 services or limit pharmacy access points if the pharmacist, in the
10 pharmacist's professional judgment, believes it will affect the
11 pharmacist's ability to safely provide the services or negatively
12 impact patient access to medications. The pharmacy staff shall
13 offer to make an appointment for the patient or refer the patient
14 as set forth in subsection (b).

15 Sec. 4. Upon request, a pharmacy shall make the pharmacy's
16 organizational policy available to the board and shall maintain a
17 copy of the policy at the pharmacy for inspection by the board.

18 Sec. 5. (a) A pharmacy may not establish any productivity or
19 production quotas for the provision of ancillary services. This
20 section prohibits a fixed number or formula related to the duties of
21 pharmacy personnel, against which the pharmacy measures or
22 evaluates the number of times a pharmacy staff perform tasks or
23 provide services.

24 (b) Quotas under subsection (a) do not include the following that
25 is not calculated or measured by the number of tasks performed or
26 services provided:

- 27 (1) A measurement of the revenue earned by the pharmacy.
28 (2) An evaluation or measurement of the competence,
29 performance, or quality of care provided.

30 Sec. 6. A pharmacy may not discipline or otherwise retaliate
31 against a pharmacist who, in good faith, acts in accordance with
32 this chapter. For purposes of this section, discipline or retaliation
33 include any of the following:

- 34 (1) Termination or suspension of employment.
35 (2) Withholding salary increases or employee benefits to
36 which the pharmacist is otherwise entitled.
37 (3) Transferring or reassigning the pharmacist.
38 (4) Denying a promotion that otherwise would have been
39 received.
40 (5) Reducing pay.

- 1 **(6) Demoting the individual."**
- 2 Renumber all SECTIONS consecutively.
 (Reference is to SB 221 as introduced.)
