 30 is established for the purpose of:

- 31 (1) providing grants to aid the sustainable development of
 32 property under the Wabash River heritage corridor commission
 33 master plan and purposes of the commission; and
- 34 (2) paying costs incurred in fulfilling the directives of the Wabash
 35 River heritage corridor commission master plan, including
 36 multicounty projects.

37 However, the commission may not use money in the fund for the upper

2 (b) The fund shall be administered by the director under the
3 direction of the commission.

4 (c) The expenses of administering the fund shall be paid from
5 money in the fund.

6 (d) The fund consists of the following:

7 (1) Appropriations made by the general assembly.

8 (2) Interest as provided in subsection (e).

9 (3) Funds deposited under IC 14-38-1-13(d).

10 (4) Money donated to the fund.

11 (5) Money transferred to the fund from other funds.

12 (e) The treasurer of state shall invest the money in the fund not
13 currently needed to meet the obligations of the fund in the same
14 manner as other public funds may be invested. Interest that accrues
15 from these investments shall be deposited in the fund.

16 (f) Money in the fund at the end of a fiscal year does not revert to
17 the state general fund.

18 (g) Money in the fund is annually appropriated to the department of
19 natural resources for its use in fulfilling the purposes of this section."

30 **Chapter 6. River Basin Commission Administration**

31 **Sec. 1. For purposes of this chapter, the following definitions**
32 **apply:**

33 (1) "Commission" refers to a river basin commission
34 established by section 2 of this chapter.

35 (2) "Participating county" refers to a county that:

36 (A) joins a commission under section 4 of this chapter; and

37 (B) has territory within the commission.

38 **Sec. 2. (a) The following river basin commissions are**

1 established:

- 2 (1) The Maumee River basin commission.
 3 (2) The St. Joseph River basin commission.
 4 (3) The Upper Wabash River basin commission.

5 (b) After consulting with the surveyor of each county in a river
 6 basin, the director shall certify the boundaries of a commission
 7 established by subsection (a). However, a river basin commission
 8 established by subsection (a)(1), (a)(2), or (a)(3) is not required to
 9 recertify the commission's boundaries under this subsection.

10 Sec. 3. A commission established by this chapter:

- 11 (1) is a separate municipal corporation; and
 12 (2) may sue and be sued.

13 Sec. 4. The executive of a county that includes territory in a
 14 commission may do the following:

- 15 (1) Elect to participate in the commission by designating the
 16 county as a participating county.
 17 (2) Revoke the designation described in subdivision (1).

18 Sec. 5. (a) Except as provided in subsection (d), the following
 19 shall serve as voting members of the commission:

- 20 (1) A member of the county executive for a participating
 21 county.
 22 (2) The executive director or, if a county does not have an
 23 executive director, the chairman or manager of a soil and
 24 water conservation district that:
 25 (A) is subject to IC 14-32;
 26 (B) includes territory in a participating county; and
 27 (C) includes territory in the basin.
 28 (3) The county surveyor of each participating county.

29 (b) In addition to the members required under subsection (a),
 30 the required members of a commission may appoint the following
 31 voting members:

- 32 (1) Each member of the county executive for a participating
 33 county.
 34 (2) The executive of each second class city within the territory
 35 of the commission.
 36 (3) If a participating county does not have a second class city,
 37 the executive of the municipality with the largest population
 38 located within the territory of the basin.

- 1 **(4) A participating county's health officer.**
- 2 **(5) A representative of each soil and water conservation**
- 3 **district that:**
- 4 **(A) is subject to IC 14-32;**
- 5 **(B) includes territory in a participating county; and**
- 6 **(C) includes territory in the basin.**
- 7 **(6) A representative of the department of natural resources.**
- 8 **However, the representative may not be an employee or**
- 9 **elected official of a city, town, or county governmental unit.**
- 10 **(c) A representative described in subsection (b)(5) or (b)(6):**
- 11 **(1) is chosen by the entity being represented;**
- 12 **(2) serves a three (3) year term;**
- 13 **(3) is eligible for reappointment; and**
- 14 **(4) continues until a successor is appointed.**
- 15 **(d) A commission that exists on or before June 30, 2026, retains**
- 16 **the commission's existing voting members.**
- 17 **Sec. 6. (a) A member of the commission may:**
- 18 **(1) designate another individual to perform the duties of the**
- 19 **member on the commission; and**
- 20 **(2) revoke the designation described in subdivision (1).**
- 21 **(b) A designation or a revocation of a designation under this**
- 22 **section must be filed with the commission to be effective.**
- 23 **Sec. 7. (a) A commission shall annually elect from among the**
- 24 **voting members the following officers:**
- 25 **(1) A chairperson.**
- 26 **(2) A vice chairperson.**
- 27 **(3) A secretary.**
- 28 **(4) A treasurer.**
- 29 **(b) The officers elected under subsection (a) shall perform the**
- 30 **duties specified in the commission's bylaws.**
- 31 **(c) A commission may establish other offices, including an**
- 32 **executive director, and determine the means for filling the offices.**
- 33 **Any salary or benefits provided to the individual must be paid by**
- 34 **the commission that establishes the office.**
- 35 **Sec. 8. (a) Either:**
- 36 **(1) the commission; or**
- 37 **(2) a participating county;**
- 38 **but not both, may pay its members reimbursement for traveling**

1 expenses and other expenses actually incurred in connection with
 2 the member's duties as provided in the state travel policies and
 3 procedures established by the Indiana department of
 4 administration and approved by the budget agency. Money paid
 5 under subdivision (1) may only be paid from money available to
 6 the commission at the time of reimbursement.

7 (b) A county may pay members of a commission the salary per
 8 diem provided by IC 4-10-11-2.1(b) for the performance of the
 9 member's duties on the commission.

10 Sec. 9. (a) A commission shall meet at least four (4) times each
 11 calendar year.

12 (b) The following may call a meeting:

13 (1) The chairperson.

14 (2) The executive director.

15 (3) A quorum of the commission's members.

16 (c) A commission shall adopt bylaws specifying a quorum
 17 requirement.

18 (d) A member may waive notice of any meeting by filing a
 19 written waiver with the secretary of the commission.

20 Sec. 10. (a) A commission may do the following:

21 (1) Manage the commission's internal affairs.

22 (2) Employ staff.

23 (3) Subject to section 12 of this chapter, enter into contracts
 24 for purposes of this chapter.

25 (4) Exercise the powers of a political subdivision specified in
 26 a cooperative agreement described in section 12 of this
 27 chapter.

28 (5) Provide a forum for the discussion, study, and evaluation
 29 of water resource issues of common concern in the river
 30 basin.

31 (6) Facilitate and foster cooperative planning and coordinated
 32 management of the basin's water and related land resources.

33 (7) Develop positions on major water resource issues and
 34 serve as an advocate of the basin's interests before Congress
 35 and federal, state, and local governmental agencies.

36 (8) Develop plans and tools to improve water quality or
 37 mitigate flooding in the basin.

38 (9) Publicize, advertise, and distribute reports on the

1 commission's purposes, objectives, studies, and findings.

2 (10) When requested, make recommendations in matters
3 related to the commission's functions and objectives to
4 political subdivisions in the basin and to other public and
5 private agencies.

6 (11) When requested, act as a coordinating agency for
7 programs and activities of other public and private agencies
8 that are related to the commission's objectives.

9 (12) Invite government officials of other states within the river
10 basin to:

11 (A) attend the commission's meetings; and

12 (B) advise the commission upon the commission's request.

13 (b) A commission may not exercise any of the powers described
14 in subsection (a) within a nature preserve (as defined in
15 IC 14-31-1).

16 (c) This section does not exempt the commission from any other
17 statute.

18 **Sec. 11. A commission shall do the following:**

19 (1) Keep a record of the commission's resolutions,
20 transactions, and findings. A record under this subdivision is
21 a public record.

22 (2) Make an annual report of the commission's activities to
23 the executive of each participating county. The commission
24 shall upon request make an annual report to the following:

25 (A) The governor.

26 (B) Any member of the general assembly.

27 (3) Prepare and adopt an annual budget.

28 (4) Submit the budget described in subdivision (3) to the
29 executive of each participating county and, upon request,
30 make the budget available to each agency appropriating
31 money to the commission.

32 **Sec. 12. (a) A political subdivision in a participating county may**
33 **under IC 36-1-7 enter into a cooperative agreement with a**
34 **commission and at least one (1) other legal entity, including a legal**
35 **entity in another state.**

36 (b) If a commission intends to enter into a cooperative
37 agreement under subsection (a), the commission shall post public
38 notice of the proposed cooperative agreement at least ten (10)

1 business days before the meeting at which the cooperative
2 agreement is scheduled to be voted on by the commission.

3 (c) Before a commission may vote on the cooperative agreement
4 under this section, the cooperative agreement must be approved by
5 the department.

6 Sec. 13. A commission may adopt a resolution to do any one (1)
7 or more of the following:

8 (1) Require that increased water runoff resulting from new
9 construction be impounded on the construction site.

10 (2) Permit the requirement of onsite water impoundment
11 under subdivision (1) to be waived upon payment of a
12 reasonable fee by the developer of the new construction.

13 (3) Restrict construction within the one hundred (100) year
14 flood plains of the river basin.

15 Sec. 14. (a) The commission may establish an executive board
16 consisting of the following:

17 (1) The chairperson of the commission.

18 (2) One (1) member from each participating county that is not
19 represented by the chairperson, to be chosen in a manner
20 prescribed by the commission's bylaws.

21 (b) The commission may delegate to the executive board the
22 power to do the following:

23 (1) Recommend agenda items and activities to the
24 commission.

25 (2) Conduct hearings on proposed commission projects.

26 (3) Perform other administrative duties assigned by the
27 commission.

28 Sec. 15. (a) The commission may appoint an advisory committee
29 to assist the commission.

30 (b) A member of an advisory committee is not entitled to
31 compensation for serving on the advisory committee.

32 Sec. 16. The commission may adopt a bylaw to govern member
33 participation in:

34 (1) a commission's; or

35 (2) an executive board's;

36 meeting by electronic communication.

37 Sec. 17. (a) A commission may receive grants and
38 appropriations from the following:

- 1 (1) Federal, state, and local governments.
- 2 (2) Individuals, foundations, and other organizations.
- 3 **However, a commission is not eligible for funding through the**
- 4 **Wabash River heritage corridor commission established by**
- 5 **IC 14-13-6-6.**
- 6 (b) The commission may enter into an agreement or contract
- 7 **regarding the acceptance or use of the grants and appropriations**
- 8 **described in subsection (a) for the purpose of carrying out the**
- 9 **commission's activities under this chapter.**
- 10 **Sec. 18. (a) A participating county may budget, appropriate, and**
- 11 **disburse money to carry out the purposes of the commission under**
- 12 **this chapter.**
- 13 (b) The appropriation from the participating county that is
- 14 **needed for all or part of the commission's budget must be either:**
- 15 (1) apportioned among the participating counties in direct
- 16 relationship to the amount of land area in each participating
- 17 county certified under section 2 of this chapter; or
- 18 (2) divided equally among the participating counties.
- 19 (c) The appropriation that is needed under subsection (b) shall
- 20 **be presented to the county executive at the same time that budgets**
- 21 **are presented by county officers.**
- 22 **Sec. 19. (a) The commission shall make expenditures only as**
- 23 **budgeted. However, the commission may revise the budget at any**
- 24 **time to authorize unbudgeted expenditures.**
- 25 (b) Any appropriated amounts remaining unexpended or
- 26 **unencumbered at the end of the fiscal year become part of a**
- 27 **nonreverting cumulative fund to be held in the name of the**
- 28 **commission. The commission may authorize unbudgeted**
- 29 **expenditures from this fund.**
- 30 (c) The commission is responsible for the safekeeping and
- 31 **deposit of money the commission receives under this chapter. The**
- 32 **state board of accounts shall:**
- 33 (1) prescribe the methods and forms for keeping; and
- 34 (2) periodically audit;
- 35 **the accounts, records, and books of the commission.**
- 36 (d) The treasurer of the commission may receive, disburse, and
- 37 **handle money belonging to the commission, subject to the**
- 38 **following:**

- 1 (1) Applicable statutes.
- 2 (2) Procedures established by the commission.
- 3 **Sec. 20. (a) For the purposes of this chapter, the commission**
- 4 **may do the following:**
- 5 (1) Acquire by grant, gift, purchase, or devise, and dispose of,
- 6 conservation easements under IC 32-23-5 in land:
- 7 (A) within; or
- 8 (B) adjacent to if part of the same parcel;
- 9 **the one hundred (100) year flood plains and the wetlands in**
- 10 **the basin.**
- 11 (2) Acquire, by grant, gift, purchase, or devise, improvements:
- 12 (A) within; or
- 13 (B) adjacent to if part of the same parcel;
- 14 **the one hundred (100) year flood plains of the basin for the**
- 15 **purpose of removing those improvements.**
- 16 (3) Acquire, dispose of, hold, use, improve, maintain, operate,
- 17 own, manage, or lease real or personal property by grant, gift,
- 18 purchase, or devise for the purposes of this chapter.
- 19 **(b) The commission may exercise the powers granted by this**
- 20 **section as follows:**
- 21 (1) For purposes of IC 32-23-5.
- 22 (2) To contribute to the following:
- 23 (A) Flood mitigation.
- 24 (B) Flood damage reduction.
- 25 (C) Improvements in water quality.
- 26 (D) Soil conservation.
- 27 **Sec. 21. (a) The commission, the executive board, or employees**
- 28 **or authorized representatives of the commission acting under this**
- 29 **chapter may:**
- 30 (1) enter the land lying within the one hundred (100) year
- 31 flood plain of any watercourse in the river basin; and
- 32 (2) enter land lying outside the one hundred (100) year flood
- 33 plain to gain access to land lying within the one hundred (100)
- 34 year flood plain in the river basin;
- 35 **if necessary to investigate, examine, or survey the land or**
- 36 **investigate suspected violations of the Indiana flood control laws.**
- 37 **(b) The commission must give twenty-one (21) days written**
- 38 **notice to:**

- 1 (1) an owner of the affected land;
- 2 (2) a contract purchaser of the affected land; or
- 3 (3) if the land is municipal property (as described in
- 4 IC 6-1.1-10-5(a)), the executive of the municipality;
- 5 before exercising the right to enter land under this section. The
- 6 notice must state the purpose of the entry and that there is a right
- 7 of appeal under this section.

8 (c) A person described in subsection (b)(1) through (b)(3) may,

9 within the twenty-one (21) day notice period required by

10 subsection (b), appeal the proposed entry under subsection (a) to

11 the commission on the grounds that the proposed entry is not

12 necessary. If a person appeals under this subsection, the

13 commission shall hold a hearing on the necessity of the entry before

14 the right of entry is exercised.

15 (d) A person entering land under this section must use due care

16 to avoid damage to:

- 17 (1) crops; or
- 18 (2) fences, buildings, and other structures.

19 (e) Neither the commission, the executive board, nor employees

20 or authorized representatives of the commission acting under this

21 chapter commits criminal trespass under IC 35-43-2-2 by entering
