**Summary of Legislation:** The bill amends the definition of "dispense" for purposes of the INSPECT program. It allows the Board of Pharmacy to disclose prescription drug monitoring program data to a representative of the Indiana Department of Health (IDOH) and the Office of the Secretary of Family and Social services (FSSA) in certain circumstances.

**Effective Date:** July 1, 2026.

**Explanation of State Expenditures:** (Revised) Currently, the Professional Licensing Agency has a secure file transfer protocol set up for sending and receiving secure data, which could be used to submit INSPECT data required by the bill to either the IDOH or the FSSA.
