Summary of Legislation: *Dispensers*– The bill sets forth the circumstances in which a dispenser is not required to transmit certain information to the INSPECT program.

Compliance with Federal Regulations– The bill requires an opioid treatment program to, before reporting patient information to the program, comply with federal regulations in obtaining patient consent.

Disclosure of Data– The bill allows the Board of Pharmacy to disclose prescription drug monitoring program data to a representative of the Indiana Department of Health (IDOH) and the Office of the Secretary of Family and Social services (FSSA) for specified purposes.

Effective Date: July 1, 2026.

Explanation of State Expenditures: *Dispensers*– The Professional Licensing Agency (PLA) may elect to update affected stakeholders of this provision’s changes. Typically, the PLA will update changes via their website and email to stakeholders. These are routine administrative functions of the PLA and would be able to be accomplished within the PLA’s existing level of resources.

Compliance with Federal Regulations– The PLA may update affected stakeholders of the federal regulations (42 CFR 2.31 and 2.36) regarding patient consent. This could be accomplished when updating stakeholders regarding the transmittal of information to the INSPECT program.

Disclosure of Data– Currently, the PLA has a secure file transfer protocol set up for sending and receiving secure data, which could be used to submit INSPECT data required by the bill to either the IDOH or the FSSA.
