1        A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION recognizing the Indiana  
2        horse racing industry.

3        *Whereas, Standardbred racing in Indiana, where drivers  
4        ride in small two-wheel carts pulled by the horses, dates back  
5        to the 19th century, where it began as an exciting family outing  
6        at many county fairs;*

7        *Whereas, Thoroughbred racing, which is the stereotypical  
8        horse racing around a track, has also taken place in Indiana  
9        since the 19th century;*

10       *Whereas, Quarter horse racing in Indiana, where horses  
11       sprint in a straight line, dates back to the 1950s, and quickly  
12       became a fixture at the Indiana State Fair due to its fast pace;*

13       *Whereas, Outside of racing, Hoosiers have also had their  
14       hand in breeding horses for racing for decades, which led to  
15       breed development programs being created in the 1990s;*

16       *Whereas, The first official Hoosier horse racetrack was  
17       built in Anderson, which opened in 1994, followed by a second  
18       track that was opened in Shelbyville in 2002;*

19       *Whereas, Horse racing has a huge impact on Indiana's  
20       economy, estimated to be \$2 billion annually, in addition to  
21       employing over 10,000 people in the industry;*

22       *Whereas, The impact of horse racing stretches across all 92  
23       counties, and in its 2022 economic impact study, Purdue*

1       *University estimated that over 12,000 horses are involved*  
2       *statewide in Indiana's racing and breeding programs; and*

3       *Whereas, Horse racing continues to grow, providing*  
4       *opportunities for owners, breeders, trainers, and Hoosiers all*  
5       *over to participate in one of the state's most historical*  
6       *activities: Therefore,*

7       *Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly*  
8       *of the State of Indiana, the House of Representatives*  
9       *concurring:*

10       SECTION 1. That the Indiana General Assembly  
11       recognizes the tremendous impact the horse racing industry has  
12       across the State of Indiana.
