Description of fiscal impact

SB 488 amends Consumer Protections laws administered by the Department of Justice. There is no fiscal impact.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions

Department of Justice

1. This bill will not have a fiscal impact on the Department of Justice. Section 1 codifies federal regulations in state law. The department can cover costs associated with Section 1 within existing resources. Section 2 and Section 3 clarify existing law for claims brought by the state and private parties. This codification of existing law does not have a fiscal impact on the department. Section 4 removes the requirement for an annual report of enforcement actions under 30-14-159, MCA, and removes the department's enforcement authority. The department has not undertaken any enforcement actions under 30-14-159, MCA, so the changes under 30-14-159, MCA, do not have a fiscal impact on the department.
