13	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Appropriations for reclamation and development grants. (1) There is		
14	appropriated up to \$1.5 million \$750,000 from the natural resources projects state special revenue account		
15	established in 15-38-302 to the department of natural resources and conservation for grants for planning		
16	reclamation and development projects to be awarded by the department over the course of the biennium		
17	beginning July 1, 2025.		
18	(2) There is appropriated up to \$5.3 million from the natural resources projects state special		
19	revenue account established in 15-38-302 to the department of natural resources and conservation for grants		
20	for pilot water storage planning and projects to be awarded by the department over the course of the biennium		
21	beginning July 1, 2025.		
22	(3)(2) There is appropriated \$7,110,975 \$3,774,208 from the natural resources projects state special		
23	revenue account established in 15-38-302 to the department of natural resources and conservation for grants to		
24	political subdivisions and local governments during the biennium beginning July 1, 2025. The funds in this		
25	subsection (3)(2) must be awarded by the department to the named entities for the described purposes and in		
26	the grant amounts set out in subsection (5)-(4) subject to the conditions set forth in [sections 2 and 3] and the		
27	contingencies described in the reclamation and development grants program report to the 69th legislature titled:		
28	"Governor's Executive Budget Fiscal Years 2026–2027 Volume 5".

22	NEW S	SECTION. Section 3. Con	dition of grants. The disbursemen	t of funds under [section 1] is	
23	3 subject to the following conditions that must be met by the grant recipient:				
24	1 (1) The grant recipient must have a scope of work, schedule, and budget for the project the				
25	approved by the department of natural resources and conservation. Any changes in scope of work or budget				
26	subsequent to legislative approval may not alter project goals and objectives. Changes in activities that would

conservation reports and applicant testimony to the 69th legislature may result in a proportional reduction in the

1 grant amount.

2 (2) The grant recipient shall document that other matching funds required for the completion of the
3 project are firmly committed.

4 (3) The grant recipient must have a project management plan that clearly outlines the roles of 5 participating entities and that is approved by the department of natural resources and conservation.

6 (4) The grant recipient shall comply with the auditing and reporting requirements provided for in 2-7 7-503 and establish a financial accounting system that the department can reasonably ensure conforms to

8 generally accepted accounting principles. Tribal governments shall comply with the auditing and reporting

9 requirements provided for in 2 CFR 200.

10 (5) The grant recipient shall submit documentation to the department demonstrating satisfactory 11 completion of the conditions of described in the recommendation section of the project narrative of the program 12 report to the legislature for the biennium ending June 30, 2027, or, in the case of planning grants issued under 13 [section 1(1)], complete the conditions specified at the time of written notification of the approved grant

14 authority.

15 (6) The grant recipient shall execute a grant agreement with the department of natural resourcesand conservation.

17 (7) Any other specific requirements considered necessary by the department must be met to
18 accomplish the purpose of the grant as evidenced from the application to the department or from the proposal
19 as presented to the legislature.

20

21 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 4. Appropriations established. There is appropriated to any entity of state 22 government that receives a grant under [section 1] the amount of the grant upon award of the grant by the 23 department of natural resources and conservation. Grants to entities from prior biennia are reauthorized for the 24 completion of contract work.

25

26 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 5. Approval of grants -- completion of biennial appropriation. The 27 legislature, pursuant to 90-2-1111, approves the reclamation and development grants listed in [section 1]. The 28 authorization of these grants constitutes a biennial appropriation from the natural resources projects state



1 special revenue account established in 15-38-302.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 6. Notification to tribal governments. The secretary of state shall send a
 copy of [this act] to each federally recognized tribal government in Montana.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 7. Coordination instruction. (1) If both [this act] and an act that provides
 additional funding for reclamation and development grants from a source other than the natural resources

8 projects state special revenue account established in 15-38-302 are passed and approved, the projects listed in

9 [section 1(5) of this act] [section 1(4) of this act] that do not receive funding from the appropriations in [section

in the order of completion of the conditions of [section 3 of this act]; and

10 1(3) of this act] in [section 1(2) of this act] may receive funding from the appropriation in the other act

11 designated for reclamation and development grants as follows:

13 (b) to the extent that there is appropriation authority available.

14 (2) If both [section 1(1)(b) of House Bill No. 6] and [section 1(1) of this act] are passed and

15 approved and if all of the \$1.5 million \$750,000 in grant funds authorized in [section 1(1) of this act] are not

16 expended for planning reclamation and development projects by the end of the biennium, then projects eligible

17 for funding under [section 1(1)(b) of House Bill No. 6] are eligible to apply for funding under [section 1(1) of this

- 18 act] for renewable resource project planning grants.

20 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 8. Severability. If a part of [this act] is invalid, all valid parts that are 21 severable from the invalid part remain in effect. If a part of [this act] is invalid in one or more of its applications, 22 the part remains in effect in all valid applications that are severable from the invalid applications. 23

24 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 9. Effective date. [This act] is effective July 1, 2025.
