5	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT IMPLEMENTING THE RECLAMATION AND DEVELOPMENT
6	GRANTS PROGRAM; APPROPRIATING MONEY TO THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES AND
7	CONSERVATION FOR GRANTS UNDER THE RECLAMATION AND DEVELOPMENT GRANTS PROGRAM;
8	PRIORITIZING PROJECT GRANTS AND AMOUNTS; ESTABLISHING CONDITIONS FOR GRANTS; AND
9	PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE."

11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
12	
13	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Appropriations for reclamation and development grants. (1) There is
14	appropriated up to \$1.5 million TO \$750,000 from the natural resources projects state special revenue account
15	established in 15-38-302 to the department of natural resources and conservation for grants for planning
16	reclamation and development projects to be awarded by the department over the course of the biennium
17	beginning July 1, 2025.
18	
19	(2) There is appropriated up to \$5.3 million from the natural resources projects state special
20	revenue account established in 15-38-302 to the department of natural resources and conservation for grants
21	for pilot water storage planning and projects to be awarded by the department over the course of the biennium
22	beginning July 1, 2025.
23	(3) (2) There is appropriated \$7,110,975 \$3,774,208 from the natural resources projects state special
24	revenue account established in 15-38-302 to the department of natural resources and conservation for grants to
25	political subdivisions and local governments during the biennium beginning July 1, 2025. The funds in this
26	subsection (3) (2) must be awarded by the department to the named entities for the described purposes and in
27	the grant amounts set out in subsection (5) (4) subject to the conditions set forth in [sections 2 and 3] and the
28	contingencies described in the reclamation and development grants program report to the 69th legislature titled:

18	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Coordination of fund sources for grants to political subdivisions
19	and local governments. A grant recipient listed under [section 1(5)] [SECTION 1(4)] may not receive funds from
20	both the reclamation and development grants program and the renewable resource grant and loan program for
21	the same project during the same biennium.
22	
23	NEW SECTION. Section 3. Condition of grants. The disbursement of funds under [section 1] is
24	subject to the following conditions that must be met by the grant recipient:
25	(1) The grant recipient must have a scope of work, schedule, and budget for the project that is
26	approved by the department of natural resources and conservation. Any changes in scope of work or budget
27	subsequent to legislative approval may not alter project goals and objectives. Changes in activities that would
28	reduce the public or natural resource benefits as presented in department of natural resources and



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conservation reports and applicant testimony to the 69th legislature may result in a proportional reduction in the
 grant amount.

3 (2) The grant recipient shall document that other matching funds required for the completion of the
4 project are firmly committed.

5 (3) The grant recipient must have a project management plan that clearly outlines the roles of 6 participating entities and that is approved by the department of natural resources and conservation.

7 (4) The grant recipient shall comply with the auditing and reporting requirements provided for in 27-503 and establish a financial accounting system that the department can reasonably ensure conforms to
9 generally accepted accounting principles. Tribal governments shall comply with the auditing and reporting
10 requirements provided for in 2 CFR 200.

11 (5) The grant recipient shall submit documentation to the department demonstrating satisfactory

12 completion of the conditions of described in the recommendation section of the project narrative of the program

report to the legislature for the biennium ending June 30, 2027, or, in the case of planning grants issued under

14 [section 1(1)], complete the conditions specified at the time of written notification of the approved grant

15 authority.

16 (6) The grant recipient shall execute a grant agreement with the department of natural resources17 and conservation.

18 (7) Any other specific requirements considered necessary by the department must be met to 19 accomplish the purpose of the grant as evidenced from the application to the department or from the proposal 20 as presented to the legislature.

22 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 4. Appropriations established. There is appropriated to any entity of state 23 government that receives a grant under [section 1] the amount of the grant upon award of the grant by the 24 department of natural resources and conservation. Grants to entities from prior biennia are reauthorized for the 25 completion of contract work.

27 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 5. Approval of grants -- completion of biennial appropriation. The
 28 legislature, pursuant to 90-2-1111, approves the reclamation and development grants listed in [section 1]. The



1	authorization of these grants constitutes a biennial appropriation from the natural resources projects state	
2		
	special revenue account established in 15-38-302.

4	NEW SECTION. Section 6. Notification to tribal governments. The secretary of state shall send a	
5	copy of [this act] to each federally recognized tribal government in Montana.	
6		
7	NEW SECTION. Section 7. Coordination instruction. (1) If both [this act] and an act that provides	
8	additional funding for reclamation and development grants from a source other than the natural resources	
9	projects state special revenue account established in 15-38-302 are passed and approved, the projects listed in	n
10	[section 1(5) of this act] [SECTION 1(4) OF THIS ACT] that do not receive funding from the appropriations in [section	n
11	1(3) of this act] IN [SECTION 1(2) OF THIS ACT] may receive funding from the appropriation in the other act	
12	designated for reclamation and development grants as follows:	
13	(a) in the order of completion of the conditions of [section 3 of this act]; and	
14	(b) to the extent that there is appropriation authority available.	
15	(2) If both [section 1(1)(b) of House Bill No. 6] and [section 1(1) of this act] are passed and	
16	approved and if all of the \$1.5 million \$750,000 in grant funds authorized in [section 1(1) of this act] are not	
17	expended for planning reclamation and development projects by the end of the biennium, then projects eligible	!
18	for funding under [section 1(1)(b) of House Bill No. 6] are eligible to apply for funding under [section 1(1) of this	;
19	act] for renewable resource project planning grants.	
20		
21	NEW SECTION. Section 8. Severability. If a part of [this act] is invalid, all valid parts that are	
22	severable from the invalid part remain in effect. If a part of [this act] is invalid in one or more of its applications,	
23	the part remains in effect in all valid applications that are severable from the invalid applications.

25	NEW SECTION. Section 9. Effective date. [This act] is effective July 1, 2025.
