

1 SENATE BILL NO. 466  
2 INTRODUCED BY D. LENZ

4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT ESTABLISHING FACTORS THAT MUST BE CONSIDERED  
5 WHEN DETERMINING THE BEST INTERESTS OF A CHILD."

7 WHEREAS, children and minors are too often an afterthought in policymaking even though every  
8 aspect of government policy impacts kids, from health care to transportation. The government has no way to  
9 evaluate whether policies would be good or bad for children, and no unified standard to use for that evaluation;  
10 and

11 WHEREAS, due to the age of children and minors and their dependency, maturity, and lack of  
12 mechanisms to make the case for their own interests and needs, children depend on adults in society and  
13 government to support their health and well-being; and

14 WHEREAS, without a clear mandate to consider their needs, children will continue to be disregarded in  
15 policy decisions that impact their lives and well-being; and

16 WHEREAS, a "best interests of the child" standard is the priority of policymaking that creates a  
17 benchmark through which all policies can be evaluated and would make positive outcomes for children.

19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

21 **NEW SECTION. Section 1. Best interests of child -- factors to consider.** (1) In any circumstance  
22 in which the best interests of a child must be determined, the following factors, to the extent they are present,  
23 must be considered but are not exhaustive:

24 (a) the physical and emotional safety of the child;  
25 (b) the temperament and developmental needs of the child;  
26 (c) the capacity and the disposition of the parents to understand and meet the needs of the child;  
27 (d) any relevant and material information obtained from the child, including the informed  
28 preferences of the child;

28 **NEW SECTION. Section 2. Codification instruction.** [Section 1] is intended to be codified as a new
