12	through 85-3-4	24, a person may not intentionally inject, release, or disperse chemicals, chemi	cal compounds,
13	substances, or	apparatuses within the borders of Montana from an aircraft expressly for:	
14	(a)	engaging in weather modification and control;	
15	(b)	affecting temperature; or	
16	(C)	affecting the intensity of the sunlight.	
17	(2)	As used in this section:	
18	<u>(a)</u>	"aircraft" means any manned or unmanned aerial vehicle or devise that is use	d or intended to
19	be used for flig	<u>ht in the air;</u>	
20	(a)<u>(b)</u>	"chemical compounds" means any combination of any number of chemicals;	
21	(b) (c)	"chemicals" means industrial substances, whether simple, compound, or obtain	ined through the
22	process of the	science and art of chemistry, whether of organic or inorganic origin; and	
23	(c)(d)	"weather modification and control" means changing or controlling or attemptin	g to change or

11	(3)	The department may determine not to hold a public hearing only if after giving	notice of a	
12	hearing, no pe	erson files a notice of intent to appear at the hearing to contest the issuance of a	permit. If a	
13	hearing is not	hearing is not held, the department may grant or conditionally grant a permit based on the information		
14	contained in th	contained in the application and the department's report.		
15	(4)	Costs incurred by the department in holding a hearing under subsection (2) me	ust be paid by	
16	the applicant."
