SB 592 (Wiener) - State Board of Barbering and Cosmetology: licensee information

Bill Summary: Senate Bill 592 would require the Board of Barbering and Cosmetology (BBC) to, where applicable, update the licensee's public profile, after a change in licenses address, on the board's website.

Fiscal Impact: Staff notes minor and absorbable costs, as existing law requires the Board to update its records after it received notification that the licensee's address has changed.

Background: Existing law requires BBC licensees to notify the BBC of a change in address within 30 days of the change, and requires BBC to update its records accordingly (BPC §7400).

Proposed Law: Senate Bill 592 would require the Board of Barbering and Cosmetology to, where applicable, update the licensee's public profile, after a change in licenses address, on the board's website.

Staff Comments: The BBC licenses and regulates over 550,000 licensees. Each profession has its own scope of practice, entry-level requirements, and professional settings, with some overlap in areas. The BBC's licensing population includes: barbers; barber apprentices; cosmetology apprentices; cosmetologists; electrologists; estheticians; manicurists; establishments; and, mobile units.
