Bill Summary: AB 356 authorizes the California Department of Public Health to issue a one-time, temporary permit to operate fluoroscopic x-ray equipment to a California licensed physician, surgeon, or doctor of podiatric medicine if the licensee has used fluoroscopy in another state.

The following information is revised to reflect amendments adopted by the committee on August 26, 2021

Fiscal Impact: The California Department of Public Health anticipates total costs of \$619,904 in the first year and \$218,340 ongoing to address an increase in administrative workload to issue the temporary permits (Radiation Control Fund).

Author Amendments:

- Require an applicant for a temporary fluoroscopy permit to attest that they have operated or supervised the use of fluoroscopy in their practice outside of California more than 10 times in surgery.
- Specify that an applicant's license must also be unrestricted to qualify for a temporary permit.
- Make a minor clarifying change.
