Bill Summary: AB 1329 would make specified changes to the administration of workers' compensation claims from the Subsequent Injuries Benefits Trust Fund

(SIBTF).

****** ANALYSIS ADDENDUM - SUSPENSE FILE *******

The following information is revised to reflect amendments adopted by the committee on August 29, 2025

Fiscal Impact:

- The Department of Industrial Relations (DIR) would likely incur costs in the hundreds of thousands of dollars annually to implement the provisions of the bill. (Workers' Compensation Administration Revolving Fund).
- To the extent that this bill results in lower workers' compensation for employers, the bill would result in savings to the State as a direct employer (General Fund or special fund). The magnitude is unknown.

Author Amendments:

- Disallow certain conditions from being considered in the calculation for permanent disability: acid reflux, diabetes, sleep apnea, and sexual dysfunction.
- Reestablish a 5-year statute of limitations on SIBTF applications, beginning January 1, 2026.
