

(Without Reference to File)**CONCURRENCE IN SENATE AMENDMENTS**

AB 182 (Pellerin and Wiener)

As Amended June 26, 2026

2/3 vote. Urgency. Budget Bill Appropriation Takes Effect Immediately.

SUMMARY

Specifies the ballot order and proposition numbers for certain ballot measures appearing on this November's ballot.

Senate Amendments

Delete the Assembly-approved version of the bill, and instead:

- 1) Require that the following ballot measures appearing on the November 2026 general election ballot be designated on the ballot in the following order and with the following proposition numbers:
 - a) Require SB 417 (Limón), Chapter 16, Statutes of 2026, known as the "Veterans and Affordable Housing Bond Act of 2026," to appear on the ballot first, and to be designated as Proposition 1.
 - b) Require ACA 20 (Gabriel), Resolution Chapter 130, Statutes of 2026, known as the "Save for California's Future Act," to appear on the ballot second, and to be designated as Proposition 2.
 - c) Require the initiative measure titled "Provides Permanent Funding for Schools and Healthcare by Extending Existing Tax on High Incomes," (Attorney General tracking number 25-0016; Secretary of State tracking number 1993) to appear on the ballot third and to be designated as Proposition 3.
 - d) Require SB 42 (Umberg), Chapter 245, Statutes of 2025, known as the "California Fair Elections Act of 2026," to appear on the ballot fourth, and to be designated as Proposition 4.
 - e) Require SCA 1 (Newman), Resolution Chapter 204, Statutes of 2024, related to the recall of elected state officers, to appear on the ballot fifth and to be designated as Proposition 5.
 - f) Specify that this bill does not affect the placement or numbering of any ballot measure that qualifies for the November 2026 general election ballot other than those specified above.
- 2) Add an urgency clause, allowing this bill to take effect immediately upon enactment.

COMMENTS

On June 26, 2026, Secretary of State Shirley N. Weber, Ph.D., certified that 14 state ballot measures had qualified for the November 3, 2026, general election ballot. Five of those measures

were placed on the ballot by the Legislature, and nine qualified through the initiative process. Secretary Weber has not yet assigned proposition numbers to these statewide ballot measures.

This bill specifies the ballot order and proposition numbers for five of the 14 measures that will appear on the ballot this November. The other nine measures would be ordered and assigned a proposition number in accordance with the requirements of existing law.

The Legislature frequently has enacted legislation to specify the ballot order and proposition numbers for measures appearing on the statewide ballot, including through SB 280 (Cervantes), Chapter 97, Statutes of 2025; AB 440 (Pellerin), Chapter 82, Statutes of 2024; SB 326 (Eggman), Chapter 790, Statutes of 2023; AB 531 (Irwin), Chapter 789, Statutes of 2023; SB 131 (Committee on Budget and Fiscal Review), Chapter 65, Statutes of 2022; and AB 1471 (Rendon), Chapter 188, Statutes of 2014.
