

thus extending indefinitely the requirement for a bar or nightclub to offer customers a drug testing device or drink lid.

- 3) **Related Legislation.** AB 668 (Lowenthal) would have required compliance with specified drink spiking requirements, including the provision of drink lids and drug testing devices, at large outdoor events. AB 668 was held on the Senate Appropriations Committee's suspense file.
- 4) **Prior Legislation.** AB 1524 (Lowenthal), Chapter 679, Statutes of 2024, required certain college campus health centers to stock an accessible supply of free drug testing devices.

AB 2389 (Lowenthal), Chapter 310, Statutes of 2024, required Type 48 licensees to contact and provide information to law enforcement and emergency medical services when a customer alerts the licensee of drink spiking.

AB 2402 (Lowenthal), Chapter 829, Statutes of 2024, requires a Responsible Beverage Service training course to include best practices to prevent or protect a person from drink spiking, and what to do if a person believes drink spiking has occurred.
