

CONCURRENCE IN SENATE AMENDMENTS

AB 2467 (Committee on Education)

As Amended August 27, 2026

2/3 vote. Urgency

SUMMARY

Includes numerous technical and noncontroversial changes to the Education Code, including provisions relating to military family residency for school enrollment, teacher candidate background checks, identification of multilingual transitional kindergarten (TK) students, eligibility requirements for the State Seal of Biliteracy, and clean-up of charter school language.

Senate Amendments

- 1) Extends the timelines by one year for the Superintendent of Public Instruction, and local educational agencies (LEAs) to test and administer a screening instrument to identify multilingual learners in TK.
- 2) Updates the State Seal of Biliteracy eligibility requirements to align with recent State Board of Education (SBE) actions.
- 3) Corrects the terminology "pupil to teacher ratio" and instead uses the correct term "average daily attendance to full time equivalent certificated employee ratio."
- 4) Deletes a statutory reference that unintentionally created a higher requirement for charter schools than other LEAs regarding the instances where fines are assessed for hiring teachers without teaching credentials.
- 5) Eliminates a time lapse during which charter school authorizers were not required to review charter school audits.
- 6) Clarifies that a charter authorizer is required to notify a charter of material concerns in a timely manner annually by a date certain.
- 7) Corrects an oversight in LEA contracting, by (1) exempting family childcare providers and license-exempt childcare providers from requirements to hold a business license and appropriate insurance; and (2) exempting childcare and expanded learning providers from the prohibition on charging fees to parents

COMMENTS

This bill includes numerous technical clean-up provisions as well as an urgency clause so that the provisions go into effect in time for the 2026-27 school year.

The U.S. Department of Defense writes, "California led the nation by enacting the first Advance Enrollment law in 2016, which allows military families to enroll their children prior to entering the state. While it has been effective in easing a major challenge for families, after a decade in

practice, some administrative barriers to implementation and access have been identified by families and school staff.

AB 2467 will address implementation challenges by making minor, but important technical changes to existing law. Enactment of this bill will reinforce California's commitment to being a welcoming state for military families and will continue to facilitate a stable educational environment for their children."
