Bill Summary: AB 564 would make specified changes to the Cannabis Excise Tax

rate.

****** ANALYSIS ADDENDUM - SUSPENSE FILE ********

The following information is revised to reflect amendments adopted by the committee on August 29, 2025

Fiscal Impact: The California Department of Tax and Fee Administration (CDTFA) indicates that this bill would result in reduced cannabis excise revenues of \$135 million in 2025-26, and \$180 million in 2027-28 (Cannabis Tax Fund). Additionally, the estimated sales and use tax revenue loss for 2025-26 would be \$11.7 million, \$5.2 million of which would come from the General Fund. Additionally, the estimated sales and use tax revenue loss for 2027-28 would be \$13.3 million, \$6.6 million of which would come from the General Fund. The department would incur administrative costs of \$145,000 in 2025-26 and \$4,000 in 2026-27 to implement the provisions of the bill (Cannabis Tax Fund).

Committee Amendments:

- Modify the period, from October 1, 2025 to June 30, 2028, when the excise tax is decreased to 15 percent.
- Require the Department of Cannabis Control, in consultation with CDTFA, to report to the Legislature by October 1, 2027 with a plan to reform cannabis taxes specifically examining adjustment to address the loss of revenue resulting from the excise tax rate reduction.
