**SB 1069 (Grayson) - Motor vehicle pollution control devices: aftermarket parts: approval process**

**Bill Summary:** This bill would make changes to the existing process for the California Air Resources Board (CARB) to issue an executive order exempting certain aftermarket vehicle parts from existing regulations, and would require CARB to report to the Legislature on its implementation of the process.

**The following information is revised to reflect amendments  
adopted by the committee on May 14, 2026**

**Fiscal Impact:**

- Ongoing costs likely in the millions of dollars annually (Air Pollution Control Fund [APCF] and Motor Vehicle Account [MVA]) for CARB to make required regulatory changes that clarify the application process and timeline, review applications within required timeframes, provide reporting and program review, conduct enforcement, track fee payments and refunds, and make other changes required in order to implement the provisions of this bill.

**Author Amendments:** Author amendments would eliminate the timelines and reporting requirements for motorcycles and off-highway vehicles.
