Bill Summary: SB 1114 places limitations on specified state entities' disclosure of information pertaining to orientation, gender identity, and variations in sex characteristics/intersex status (SOGISC) collected under the Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, and Intersex Disparities Reduction Act (Act).

******* ANALYSIS ADDENDUM – SUSPENSE FILE *******

**The following information is revised to reflect amendments
adopted by the committee on May 14, 2026**

Fiscal Impact: Unknown significant total costs, potentially ranging into the millions to tens of millions of dollars, for affected state agencies to comply with data limitation requirements (General Fund and various special funds). Actual costs to each impacted state agency will depend on their specific data-sharing agreements with entities outside of California state government and the extent to which they may absorb any additional associated IT expenses and workload to redact personally identifiable information.

Author Amendments:

- Remove “gender expression” from the definition of information pertaining to SOGISC.
- Specify that information pertaining to SOGISC is exempt from disclosure under the California Public Records Act, unless that information is deidentified.
- Expand limitations on the disclosure of information pertaining to SOGISC to the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV).
 - Clarify that these limitations do not apply to the sex marker or gender category currently displayed on a driver’s license or ID card issued by DMV.
- Make other technical and conforming changes.
- Add a coauthor.
