SUBJECT: National Domestic Violence Awareness Month

DIGEST: This resolution proclaims the month of October 2025, and each following October, as National Domestic Violence Awareness Month.

ANALYSIS: This resolution makes the following legislative findings:

- 1) Domestic violence affects people of all genders, sexual orientations, and ages and all racial, ethnic, cultural, social, religious, and economic groups in the United States and here in California.
- 2) There is a need to provide education, awareness, and understanding of domestic violence and its causes. There is a need to support and amplify prevention programs and community-based strategies to create healthy environments and decrease the likelihood of perpetration, thereby stopping domestic violence from occurring in the first place.
- 3) Children exposed to domestic violence can experience long-term consequences, including difficulty at school, substance abuse, behavioral problems in adolescence, and serious adult health problems.
- 4) All communities deserve access to culturally responsive prevention programs and initiatives to improve overall community health and safety by challenging the societal norms that perpetuate violence.
