SENATE VOTE: 36-0

SUBJECT: Mother's Day.

SUMMARY: Recognizes May 10, 2026, as the 119th annual Mother's Day; and, urges all Californians to recognize, appreciate, and be grateful for the gifts and good works of mothers on that day. Specifically, **this resolution** makes the following legislative findings:

- 1) The first Mother's Day was held on the second Sunday in May 1907 in West Virginia. President Woodrow Wilson signed a congressional resolution in 1914 making Mother's Day an officially recognized day.
- 2) A mother is one who nurtures her family, her community, her country, and her world. Mother's Day is an opportunity to become better children and show our gratitude for those women who put the needs of others before their own needs.
- 3) Each day, mothers provide counsel and serve as an example to their children and pass on the values that impact their legacy for generations. They enrich our lives by providing opportunities to grow physically, emotionally, intellectually, and spiritually.
- 4) Women are more likely to serve as the primary caregiver for their children, spouse, parents, and others. One in four mothers are raising their children without a spouse or partner.
- 5) Mother's Day also recognizes those who are trying to become mothers, those who have lost their mothers, and the people in our lives who have taken on the motherhood role.
