



SENATE BILL 2239

AN ACT to amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 63, Chapter 6 and Title 63, Chapter 9, relative to continuing education requirements.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 63-6-233, is amended by adding the following as a new subsection:

(d) In establishing continuing medical education requirements pursuant to subsection (b), the board shall require that a minimum of one (1) of the required hours be completed on topics related to nutrition.

SECTION 2. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 63-9-107(a), is amended by adding the following as a new subdivision:

(3) In establishing continuing osteopathic medical education requirements pursuant to subdivision (a)(1), the board shall require that a minimum of one (1) of the required hours be completed on topics related to nutrition.

SECTION 3. For the purpose of promulgating rules, including emergency rules, this act takes effect upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it. For all other purposes, this act takes effect on January 1, 2028, the public welfare requiring it.

House Bill No. 2562

by deleting all language after the enacting clause and substituting:

SECTION 1. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 63-6-233, is amended by adding the following as a new subsection:

(d)

(1) In establishing continuing medical education requirements pursuant to subsection (b), the board shall require each licensee to complete a minimum of one (1) of the required hours on a topic related to nutrition. A licensee is only required to complete the one (1) hour on a topic related to nutrition once.

(2) Any continuing medical education requirement related to nutrition, pursuant to subdivision (d)(1), must be available free of charge to a physician.

(3) This subsection (d) terminates January 1, 2033.

SECTION 2. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 63-9-107(a), is amended by adding the following as a new subdivision:

(3)

(A) In establishing continuing osteopathic medical education requirements for licensees, the board shall require each licensee to complete a minimum of one (1) of the required hours on a topic related to nutrition. A licensee is only required to complete the one (1) hour on a topic related to nutrition once.

(B) Any continuing osteopathic medical education requirement related to nutrition, pursuant to subdivision (a)(3)(A), must be available free of charge to a physician.

(C) This subdivision (a)(3) terminates January 1, 2033.

SECTION 3. The board of medical examiners and board of osteopathic examination are each authorized to promulgate rules, including emergency rules if necessary, to effectuate this act. The rules must be promulgated in accordance with the Uniform Administrative Procedures Act, compiled in Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 4, Chapter 5.

SECTION 4. For the purpose of promulgating rules, including emergency rules, this act takes effect upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it. For all other purposes, this act takes effect January 1, 2029, the public welfare requiring it.
