



SENATE BILL 2414

AN ACT to amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 9;
Title 49; Title 53; Title 55 and Title 68, relative to
public health.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 68-1-106, is amended by adding the following as a new subsection:

(c) By February 1 of each year, the department of health shall report to the chairs of the senate health and welfare committee and the committee in the house of representatives with jurisdiction over public health programs concerning the benefits and grants received by this state as described in this section.

SECTION 2. This act takes effect July 1, 2026, the public welfare requiring it.

AMEND Senate Bill No. 2414*

House Bill No. 2278

by deleting all language after the enacting clause and substituting:

SECTION 1. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 68-11-1303, is amended by adding the following as a new subsection:

(i)

(1) Any certificate of public advantage in effect on June 30, 2028, automatically expires; provided, that any pricing restrictions in a certificate of public advantage that are in effect as of the expiration date remain in effect until the earlier of the fifth anniversary of the expiration date or the date that a new inpatient acute care hospital opens in the geographic service area covered by the expired certificate of public advantage.

(2) After June 30, 2028, the pricing restrictions must be supervised by the attorney general and reporter pursuant to a supervision agreement, and may only be modified by the mutual written agreement of the entity subject to the pricing restrictions and the attorney general and reporter. The entity subject to the pricing restrictions is responsible for the costs of the attorney general and reporter's supervision of the pricing restrictions.

(3) This section does not limit or impair the authority of the attorney general and reporter to enforce state or federal antitrust law.

SECTION 2. This act takes effect upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it.
